

The Cal Grant Transfer Entitlement Award is for students who were not awarded a High School Entitlement Award but are now transferring from a California Community College to an eligible bachelor degree granting institution in California.

Award requirements include:

- Filing of a <u>FAFSA</u> or <u>California Dream Act Application</u> by March 2nd of award year
- Meeting financial eligibility and basic eligibility
- Graduation from a California high school after June 30, 2000
- California residency at the time of high school graduation
- Being under the age of 28
- Having a verified GPA electronically reported from a California Community College of 2.4 by March 2 of award year
- Completion of the Transfer Entitlement Verification Form on <u>WebGrants 4 Students</u>

<u>Cal Grant A</u> assists with tuition and fees at public colleges, independent colleges and some occupational or career colleges. At the University of California and the California State University, the award covers up to full system-wide fees. Coursework must be for at least two academic years.

<u>Cal Grant B</u> assists with tuition and fees as well as provides a living allowance at public colleges, independent colleges and some occupational or career colleges. The awards for tuition and fees are the same as those for Cal Grant A. Coursework must be for at least one academic year.
